Year 1 has had another great week. In History, we have continued our learning about 'The Great Fire of London', this week we had a think about what has changed because of the fire. In RE, we have thought about the crucifixion of Jesus, and we looked at different ways Catholics remember Jesus on Good Friday. We particularly liked the *alfombras* (carpets) from places such as Antigua and El Salvador. The children had a go at creating their own alfombra out of chalk.





Year 2

Another great week for Team 2.6! In English, we have enjoyed following Suzy the cat's exploits in our class text as she tries and tries again to get home to France; we are keeping our fingers crossed that she will finally make it! In Maths, we have looked at the 2-, 5- and 10-times tables and matched the corresponding division facts to write fact families that can help us solve multiplication and division problems. In RE, we have started looking at the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus in preparation for Easter. In Art, we have looked at how different types of lines can create texture and have used these for two landscapes and a fox and rabbit picture; the pictures are very impressive! In Science, we carried out an investigation into which materials are bendy and stretchy and whether they can revert back to their original state after they have been stretched or bent.
