

## Year 1


Year 1 has had another amazing week. We have been doing lots of practice for our Phonics Screening, which is happening after half term. In RE, we have been thinking about the Holy Spirit and looked when it is spoken about in the stories we have already heard. The children have made their own stained-glass windows which represent the Holy Spirit. We have also been praying to God then blowing a bubble, so it reaches Him. In Maths, we have started looking at multiplication in 2s, 5s and 10s; the children have been trying hard with this. Keep up the great work Year 1!



## Year 2

Year 2 has worked incredibly hard this week in all their lessons! In RE, we have looked in detail at the story of Pentecost and wrote two diary entries explaining what happened from the perspective of Peter. In one of our lessons, we also looked at different representations of the Holy Spirit in art and made windmill to symbolise the Holy Spirit. In Maths, we have been looking in detail at temperature, while in PE we have started practising Sports Day events. The highlight of the week would be our fantastic trip to Studland! We learnt about the different wildlife that can be found in the woodlands, on the beach and in the sea and used binoculars and magnifying glasses to observe and find different birds, insects and plants. We then went looking for 'natural treasure' on the seashore (mermaid's purses, shells, cuttlefish etc.); the pair with the highest points got a chocolate egg, while the others received a coin. Thank you to Jamie and the volunteers (Dave P, Dave W and Dawn) who helped us learn and have a fabulous time.

	
<b>Year 3</b>	 <p>Year 3 has had another fantastic week, and the children continue to impress us with their learning! The children have been doing tremendously well in their multiplication work, moving confidently towards more formal written methods – great progress all round. In English, we've been enjoying <i>Song of the Dolphin Boy</i>, and the children have been making some thoughtful and imaginative predictions about what might happen next in the story. In Science, we've been exploring the topic of light. The children have learned how light travels, the difference between light sources and reflective materials, how we see, and even how day and night occur. We've also been making the most of the lovely sunny weather with tennis coaching sessions led by instructors from the local tennis club. The children have loved being active outdoors and learning new skills on the court.</p> <p>In English we have also continued our work on playscripts. The children have been working in groups of four and have all been taking on the role of a character from the story and deciding the dialogue that they may use.</p> <p>In our topic work this week, we have been learning about how the early civilisations traded and the types of products they would trade. We also learnt about bartering and how the traders arrived at a fair price.</p> <p>Well done to everyone for a brilliant week!</p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p>Year 4 has had an excellent week. We have continued reading our class text, <i>Street Child</i>. We have been learning about non-chronological reports and their key features with a view to writing our own non-chronological report about the workhouse. In Maths, we have started a new topic on money; the children have really enjoyed this so far and have showed a good level of prior knowledge. In PE we have been practising tennis, learning the scoring system and practising playing doubles.</p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<p>Year 5 have been excellent in terms of behaviour, work ethic and being able to adapt to different circumstances as the week was differently structured due to Year 6 SATs. They were excellent at working in the hall in the morning while the SATS were taking place in their classroom. They have carried on with their work on decimals and made good progress. We</p>

	are enjoying our history focus on the Viking and Saxon struggle for the kingdom of England and we are all starting to get excited for our trip to the Ancient Technology Centre on the 3 <sup>rd</sup> June.
<b>Year 6</b>	<p>Year 6 has done extremely well and finished their SATs!!! They worked incredibly hard all week and displayed an amazing working attitude throughout. In the afternoons, they have been busy working on a business project based on 'The Apprentice'. Pupils have worked in small groups, designed new products, packaging and prepared a pitch to present in front of the class.
