
Year 1

Year 1 has had a great start to the year. We have worked hard on our lining up and Year 1 routines. In English, we have started our class text 'Rosie's walk'. They have all listened very well to the story and produced some amazing writing. In RE, we have started our learning about the Creation story, they have produced some artwork sequencing the story, this will be displayed on our RE board.



Year 2

It is official! Team 2.7 is amazing! All the children have worked incredibly hard this week – it is a challenge getting used to a new class and expectations of work and behaviour and they have truly stepped up to the plate! Mrs Norman, Miss Brown and I are very proud of them! In RE, we have looked in detail at the story of Noah and have retold the story in our own words. We have also considered where the story comes in the Bible and thinking about what the differences are between the Old and New Testaments. In Maths, we have been practising our counting skills in ones and tens. In Art, we have painted our own colour wheel with primary colours and mixing those to then paint on the secondary colours. We will be using the colour wheel



throughout the year when thinking about colour theory and selecting warm / cool / complementary colours. Well done, Year 2! Keep up the brilliant work!

Year 3	What a wonderful start to the academic year for class three. The children have all settled in exceptionally well.
	This term our topic is 'The Stone Age' and many of our lessons have been linked. In English we have begun reading our class text 'Stone Age Boy'. The children have been writing their predictions on what they feel the story is going to be about. They have studied the front
	cover and have read the blurb and used the information in these to inform their writing. In Maths we are learning about place value; ones, tens, hundreds and thousands. It has been really pleasing to see that even when the children find it a little challenging, they are
	still giving it a good go. I have been really impressed with their perseverance skills. In History, we have been completing an introduction to the 'Stone Age', it was really
	interesting to listen to all the prior knowledge that the children already have.
Year 4	Year 4 has had a brilliant start to the new school year and have settled in really well. We've begun reading our new class text The Firework Maker's Daughter, which has already captured everyone's imagination. In English, we've started working on non-chronological reports, using facts and clear structure to share information. In maths, we've been learning about place value and building strong number sense. In RE, we acted out Abraham's journey from Ur to Canaan, bringing the story to life through drama. Our geography topic on mountains is underway, and we've been using maps to locate the Seven Summits and learn more about them. We're also preparing for our football fixture
	next week and looking forward to showing off our skills on the pitch!

Year 5



Year 5 have had a brilliant start to the term, and we are really pleased with the progress they are already making across all subjects. The children have shown great enthusiasm and effort in their learning.



This Week's Learning

Maths: We have been focusing on place value and improving our recall of times tables. Pupils have also been practising their arithmetic skills through their daily "clicks."

PE: The focus has been on netball, with pupils developing their footwork and teamwork skills.

History: We have begun exploring World War II, looking at why the war started and beginning to build an understanding of this important period of history.

Science: The children have been learning about different materials and their properties. Art: Pupils used pastels to create their own "Battle of Britain" scenes, showing both creativity and attention to detail.


Well Done Year 5!
