Year 1

In RE, we went for a wonder walk to look at all the things God has made. In History, we have looked at toys that our parents and grandparents may have played with when they were younger. We looked at the difference between those and the toys we play with. We have started our cursive writing journey this week focusing on the letter 'c'. Great work, Year 1!

Team 2.7 has continued to work incredibly hard this week! In English, we have started our class text by looking at items that will appear in the story and making predictions about how they might be used or appear in the story. In Maths, we have continued counting in tens and ones and thinking about how many tens and ones are in numbers. In Art, we have found out about the artist, Piet Mondrian and then used our learning about primary and secondary colours to create our own pictures inspired by his work using felt tips and paint. In Geography, we have continued learning about the seven continents while in PE we practised our football dribbling skills. Well done, Year 2! Keep up the amazing work!

#### Year 3

It has been another busy week in Year 3. The children are all settling into the new class routines and are doing so with determination and a smile on their faces.

We have continued to read 'Stone Age Boy' and learn about the different characters and what life was like in the Stone Age. This week we have been focusing on diary writing. Firstly, the children wrote a diary entry for the boy when he discovered he had travelled to the Stone Age. They then wrote a diary entry for Om, the Stone Age girl and what a typical day looked like for her.

In Maths, we have continued to look at place value and have also been recapping the part whole method of partitioning numbers.

In RE, we finished learning about the creation story and the children then wrote about the things that they were thankful for.
