Mass to celebrate the feast of St. Francis of Assisi





Reception

We've had another busy and exciting week in Reception! We have been learning all about families, our homes and the people we love, sharing our own experiences and celebrating what makes us special. We have explored our emotions, thinking about how we feel, when we feel it and how we can recognise these feelings in ourselves and others. In maths we have been focusing on careful counting, making sure to count objects one by one and comparing groups to see who has more or fewer. What a wonderful week!







Year 1

Year 1 has had another busy week. We have started our new book in English - *Mrs Armitage on Wheels*. The children have been busy thinking about different items they could put on the bike to make it go faster. They also had to think about what they would add onto a bike if they were Mrs Armitage. In Maths, we have been thinking about more and less and have introduced crocodile hands to help with the symbols <,>,=. In RE, we have begun to learn the 'Our Father' prayer and we heard this when we all attended Mass on Friday morning for the first time.





Year 2



Year 2 has maintained their four-week streak of working hard – we hope this trend will continue! In Art, we completed our Gustav Klimt inspired paintings based on his mosaic, The Tree of Life. We are very proud of how everyone worked so diligently and carefully on their works of art. In English, we have followed Finn on his journey to where Ocean Meets Sky and have brainstormed words to describe one of the lands he visited – Library Islands – and will be writing a Captain's Log about this next week! In Maths, we have looked at different ways to partition two-digit numbers while in Geography we have focused on knowing exactly where the seven continents are on a map. In PE, we were practising our basketball skills and enjoyed this immensely! Well done, Team 2.7!

Year 3

Yet another busy week in Year 3, with lots of exciting learning occurring.

In Maths, we have begun to look at number lines up to 1000. We have been looking for patterns and filling in the missing numbers. The children are adapting brilliantly to working with a range of larger numbers. In English this week, we have concluded our work on the 'Stone Age Boy'. We ended the topic by writing a character description about Om. The children tried super hard to make their descriptions as interesting as possible by using adjectives and similes. The children then drew a picture of Om which depicted all the physical features mentioned in their character description. We also completed a nature walk in RE where we practiced mindfulness and gave thanks for our surroundings. We then went on to learn about the image that God created. We explored our own image and completed a picture which showed our inner and outer selves, and we gave thanks for all the things that make us unique. We look forward to welcoming Year 3 back on Monday, for another fun-filled week.

Year 4

Year 4 has had another great week, working hard and enjoying their learning. We've finished our non-chronological reports on mountains, and the children have done a fantastic job presenting their facts clearly and confidently. In RE, we've been celebrating

	our local environment and thinking about why it's important to care for it. In Maths, we've
	been rounding numbers to the nearest 1,000, 100 and 10, and showing great progress.
	Our Geography lessons have focused on mountain climates and what life is like in those
	regions. We've also started netball in PE, learning the basic rules and practising passing
	and movement. Well done, Year 4!
Year 5	Year 5 has had a productive week full of learning across subjects. In Science, we explored
	the differences between reversible and irreversible changes, using examples to
	understand when materials can or cannot return to their original state. In Maths, our main
	focus has been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000, and 100,000. The
	children practised spotting patterns and applying their rounding skills to problem-solving.
	In History, we began learning about the Battle of Britain, discussing its importance and
	setting the stage for further exploration of World War II. In PE, the class continued to
	develop their netball skills while also working on their general fitness through a variety of
	fun activities. Next week, we will continue to build on these skills, exploring new
	challenges in maths, deepening our understanding of World War II in history, and taking
	part in more team-based activities in PE.
Year 6	Last Friday, we went to Langton Matravers Village Hall to watch a performance called 'The
	Soldier's Tale' by Stravinsky. The musicians and actors were really talented, and it was to
	support 'Planet Purbeck'. Some of us went to Budden's Activity Centre and we did three
	activities which involved teamwork and creativity. In Geography, we recapped physical and
	human features around the United Kingdom. We also planned a route for the 'Three Peaks
	Challenge'. Some of us went to The Purbeck School to play in a football tournament which
	we won!!!!
